STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

the Constitution of provides for the formation of States and alteration of boundaries. names of existing areas. or States. Before the Constitution (Seventh Amendment) Act. 1956. enacted. was "States" the expression occurring in that article meant Part Α States, Part B States and also Part C States. By the Seventh Amendment of the Constitution in 1956. the of "Union territories" concept introduced in our Constitution but article 3 was not amended to territories". include in "Union terms It is considered proper to amend this article to make it clear that "State" in clauses (a) to (e) of that article (but not in the proviso) includes "Union territories". It is also considered proper to make it clear that power under clause (a) of article 3 includes power to form a new State or Union territory uniting a part of State or Union territory another State a to Union territory.

The Bill seeks to achieve the above objects.

THE CONSTITUTION (EIGHTEENTH AMENDMENT) ACT, 1966

[27th August, 1966.]

An Act further to amend the Constitution of India.

BE it enacted by Parliament in the Seventeenth Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

- 1. Short title.-This Act may be called the Constitution (Eighteenth Amendment) Act, 1966.
- 2. Amendment of article 3.-In article 3 of the Constitution, the following Explanations shall be inserted at the end, namely:-

`Explanation I.-In this article in clauses (a) to (e), "State" "State" includes Union territory, proviso, does but in the not include a Union territory.

Explanation II.-The power conferred on Parliament by clause (a) includes the power to form a new State or Union territory by uniting a

part of any State or Union territory to any other State or Union territory.'.
