



HIMACHAL PRADESH

PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION

The preliminary examination shall be an objective type examination consisting of the following three papers of 100 Marks each;

- Paper I-Civil Law-I •
- Paper II Civil Law II •
- Paper III Criminal Law

Each paper shall be of one-hour duration and the examination in all the three papers shall be held on the same day. The syllabus for the preliminary examination shall be the same as provided for Paper-Ito III for the Main examination.

2. Paper - II (Civil Law - II) Indian Contract Act, Hindu Law, Limitation Act, T.P.A, H.P. Urban Rent Control Act.

3. Paper - II (Criminal Law) 200 M.M. Indian Penal Code, Criminal Procedure Code, Chapter XVII Sec. (138 to 143) of Negotiable Instrument Act, H.P. Excise Act 2011, Wild Life Protection Act and Indian Forest Act.

4. Paper-IV	150 M.M.
English Essay Choice of 3 essays on general subjects	100 Marks
Translation of Hindi passage into English	50 Marks
5. Paper-V	100 M.M.
Language Hindi (in devnagri script)	
(a) Translation English to Hindi	30 Marks
(b) Essay in Hindi on any topic out of three	50 Marks
(c) Composition (idioms & correction etc.)	20 Marks
