INTERVIEW

1. The interview will carry 50 marks.
2. Only those candidates who secure at least 40% marks in the evaluation will be considered for final selection/recommendation.
3. In the case of persons with disabilities, only those candidates who secure at least 35% or more marks will be considered for final selection.
4. The purpose of this evaluation is to determine the suitability of the candidate by assessing their mental concentration, knowledge of work, clarity and logical decision-making ability, prudence in judgment, skills, perspective, integrity, interpersonal relations, communication skills, character, intellectual competence, and interests.

Interview 50 Marks - Only candidates securing 40% or more marks in Interview will be considered for final selection.
